Real life circumstances do not always clearly meet clinical guidelines. Due to the importance of timing when considering forensic exams, always call with any questions or concerns.

Population we serve:

- Any child/adolescent 15 years or younger, regardless of jurisdiction of crime.
- Special circumstances consult with Our Kids staff.

Who needs an exam?

- Any child less than 5 years of age when there are concerns of sexual abuse.
- Any child who describes something going inside their body.
- Any child who describes contact with another person's genitalia.
- Any delayed/non-verbal child.
- Child reports pain and/or bleeding.
- Any child with symptoms concerning for sexually transmissible infection (STI).
- Special circumstances/other contact Our Kids to discuss other circumstances that may require an evaluation.

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What information is needed when contacting Our Kids:

- Victim's name and age.
- Sexual abuse allegations.
- Date or approximate date of most recent sexual contact.
- Type of sexual contact.
- Any current anogenital complaints.
- Perpetrator's relationship to child/victim.
- Perpetrator's age.
- Is DCS or law enforcement involved.
- Has DCS and/or law enforcement been contacted? (DCS Child Abuse Hotline: 1-877-237-0004)
- Who will be bringing child.
- Name and phone number/contact information of person transporting child.
- Any language barriers of parent/caregiver. Language spoken.
- Are there any special needs or developmental disabilities of the child?
- Has child begun menses? Last menstrual period.
